SPORTS PREMIUM REPORT 2014/2015

'Inspire and Achieve'

1. What is Sports Premium?

Schools have been issued with funding from the Government as part of the Sport Premium initiative. This sum of money should be used to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport that each school offers.

2. Our School

At Eastnor C of E Primary School, careful consideration has been given as to how this money was spent. Our rationale for spending the money is;

- To improve the quality of the sport and PE that we are already offering to the children our school, ensuring all children benefit from the funding.
- Offer training opportunities to staff to improve teaching and learning and for CPD.
- Ensure the school is able to participate in local tournaments and host their own events.
- Encourage more participation in a wider range of after school activities for all children.

As a result of these discussions we are very pleased to explain how the Sports Premium has impacted on PE provision and development to date.

Sports Funding Statement for 2014/2015

For the academic year 2014/15 Eastnor Primary School was allocated £8,355 sports funding from the government to enhance PE and sporting provision.

Through the employment of a specialist PE teacher, the provision of high quality lessons enthused and inspired children to participate fully and develop a love for PE and school sport. Investing in new equipment and resources ensured an extensive array of traditional and non-traditional activities on offer, which in turn captured the interest and imagination of large numbers of pupils and encouraged them to participate regularly.

Local coaches concentrating on specific year groups were employed after school. They made a significant contribution to stimulating pupils' early interest and enthusiasm for play, physical activity and attitudes and behaviour.

Through such employment of additional specialist staff, we were able to increase the opportunities for more competition so that all pupils reached the performance levels they were capable of.

Measuring the Impact of Sports Premium Spending 2014/2015

As a result of the funding, school is now fully resourced. Teachers, sports specialists and sports coaches now have enough equipment for all lessons. Children are active and engaged during all parts of their lesson and during after school clubs.

Better resources have also meant that we can provide an array of both traditional and non-traditional activities can be offered to all children.

We have increased the range of sporting after-school clubs and now offer children of all ages at least one sporting club each day. This has meant that we have a greater number of children participating and developing skills and a love of sport from an early age.
