SPORTS PREMIUM REPORT 2015/2016

‘Inspire and Achieve’

1. What is Sports Premium?

Schools have been issued with funding from the Government as part of the Sport Premium initiative. This sum of money should be used to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport that each school offers.

2. Our School

At Eastnor C of E Primary School, careful consideration has been given as to how this money was spent. Our rationale for spending the money is;

- To improve the quality of the sport and PE that we are already offering to the children our school, ensuring all children benefit from the funding.
- Offer training opportunities to staff to improve teaching and learning and for CPD.
- Ensure the school is able to participate in local tournaments and host their own events.
- Encourage more participation in a wider range of after school activities for all children.

As a result of these discussions we are very pleased to explain how the Sports Premium has impacted on PE provision and development to date.

Sports Funding Statement for 2015/2016

For the academic year 2015/16 Eastnor Primary School was allocated £8, 340 sports funding from the government to enhance PE and sporting provision.

Professional development and training provided by Mrs Dawe; PE specialist, increased non- specialist staff knowledge and understanding which empowered achievement in PE across the school.

Measuring the Impact of Sports Premium Spending 2015/2016

Opportunities for new and inexperienced teachers to work with Mrs Dawe has led to a greater confidence in the delivery of sport in all lessons. Teachers are now confident to introduce new activities and try new approaches to teaching. Pupils enjoy replicating teacher demonstrations and value the positive comments, advice and praise provided by them.

This year's funding has helped secure a lunchtime playground leaders club. Older children confidently lead games and activities for our youngest children; this in turn shaped a healthy, productive environment. As part of our extensive extra-curricular curriculum, our PE specialist also runs two weekly after school clubs offering a variety of physical activities throughout the year. Mrs Dawe works alongside Miss Booton in the role of PE coordinator. Together they organise a large number of number of competitive matches and sports festivals with other schools. Often they feed into the Herefordshire Level 2 Summer and Winter School Games. In 2016 Eastnor Primary School triumphed in the cluster schools netball and rounders tournaments.

With access to the local Cricket Club, Castle and Deer Park Estate, a broad and balanced curriculum is always on offer. Children are then signposted into these local organisations.

As a result of the funding, staff have developed their confidence and skill in teaching across the P.E. curriculum; a greater number of children are now involved in sporting extra-curricular activities and the school has participated in a larger number of sporting events with other schools.
